POLICY & PROCEDURES – 2022-003 (Adopted on June 3, 2022) GAME DAY – RULES AND REGULATIONS

Following are the game-day rules and regulations. The purpose of this document is to promote awareness of SCYCA's expectation during match day and maintain consistent player conduct during home and away games. It is expected that all players fully adhere to these rules and regulations with no exceptions.

POLICY

- 1. Before the match
- 1.1. Arrive at the field before the reporting time and report to the team manager or coach.
- 1.2. Keep the kit bags in an orderly manner at the designated location identified by the team manager or coach

2. During the match

- 2.1. All players must sit together as a team at the designated location. No player should leave the area without approval from the team manager or coach.
- 2.2. No use of phone or other electronics is allowed. Phones can be used only in an emergency upon approval of the team manager or coach.
- 2.3. It is expected that all players always concentrate on the game, encouraging and motivating the teammates throughout the match.
- 2.4. Everyone must obey and respect the decisions made by the captain on field.
- 2.5. No negative comments at the times (before, during and after the match)
- 2.6. Bulling of any kind is unacceptable.
- 2.7. Parents should not interfere with or ask question the team manager or coach while the match is in progress.

3. After the match

- 3.1. All players must be present at the post match meeting and cool down.
- 3.2. During the post-match meeting all match related questions are answered by the team manager or coach. All players are encouraged to ask questions and resolve issues related to the match during the meeting.

PROCEDURE

- 1. During the match, parents must stay away from the area the team is situated.
- 2. If a parent has a question related to the match, he or she can talk to the team manager or coach after the team is dismissed. Any unresolved issues can be directed to the SCYCA secretary for further attention and necessary action.
